



Our guest speaker was DHHS Commissioner, Mary Mayhew. She also brought her assistant, Chase Martin. Commissioner Mayhew talked about where the department was, what has been done since the LePage administration took office and where she and the governor would like it to be in the future. DHHS has an annual budget of 3.4 billion dollars which comes from both state and federal sources. Of that money, 2.4 billion goes to Medicaid and health care for low income and disabled persons. Also coming under the jurisdiction of the department are programs for child welfare, the state office of CDC, public health, substance abuse, food inspection, food stamps, medical marijuana, hospitals and nursing homes to name a few. Commissioner Mayhew has been working to integrate programs and guide the department back to its core mission of helping people who need the most help. She has also been working with the Commissioners of Education and Labor and over 400 Maine businesses to help with vocational assessment and career pathing.

We had a wonderful cruise on the <u>Songo River Queen</u> last Thursday evening with the <u>Kiwanians</u>. It was a beautiful evening, not too hot, not too cold. I don't know what the count was but I'm guessing there were 50 or 60 attending.
