Our program on the 16th was Christy Gardner and her dog, Doug. Christy is a disabled veteran who started the non-profit, Mission Working Dogs, providing service dogs to veterans. She talked about the differences between therapy dogs and service dogs. Therapy dogs are emotional support dogs. They do not have any particular training and don't perform tasks. They therefore cannot go into stores or places that do not allow dogs. Service dogs are fully trained to perform tasks, remain calm and not bark. They are allowed to go wherever their owner/handler goes. Mission Working Dogs has graduated 51 dogs in 5 years and there are currently 90 dogs in the program. At the end of her talk, President Jeff presented Christy with a check for \$250.00.

Our program last week was our annual Club Protection training presented by Greg Dowty, District Protection Officer from the Dover Club. Introduced by Patty Rice, Greg has held many roles in his Club and in the District. He talked about the history of Child Protection and said that it is still a national problem and not just isolated cases with the Catholic church, the Boy Scouts and Philips-Exeter Academy still dealing with their issues. Therefore, it is important to the clubs, district and RI, that all Rotarians are trained in child protection. The policy and details can be found on the RI website.
