President Chris also discussed his plans for the year and changes that have either been or are to be implemented including: increasing the dues to \$160 and increasing the cost of breakfast and 50/50 drawing to \$10; encouraging more guests and potential Rotarians through the use of Oxford Hills Rotary Club business cards that include an invitation to breakfast; addition of a budget line item for the publicity director's use and discretion; when there is a 5th Wednesday of the month, we will meet that evening at Maurice's from 5:30 PM to 6:30 PM with light hors d'oeuvres and cash bar. Fifth Wednesday months this year will be July, September, March and June. The club has also purchased a laptop computer and a projector for club use and for the use of our programs and meetings. Lastly, the budget is available to all who wish to review it.

Paul – reviewed the current status of auction items collected and plans to move items from the storage trailer to the high school starting Friday, the 10th, at 8:00 AM. The casino box van will be available to us that morning. We also have four other sites for smaller pick-up loads in the area that morning as well. We will be sharing hosting duties with United Way of Oxford County and the Oxford American Legion for the Chamber of Commerce Business After Hours on Thursday, August 6th at the Legion in Oxford. We will be collecting donations of school supplies so don't forget to bring something.
