Teachers play a major role in working with children in need. All of the items are on line, so teachers help the students pick out the things they like and need. Volunteers pick the items, package them and deliver them to the teacher to give to the student. Packages for middle and high school students go to the guidance office for the student to pick up. Everything is totally anonymous to the Pink Feather volunteers. Nothing is sold and no \$\$ is involved. At the conclusion of her talk, Jen was presented with our "Big" check for \$500.00.
