Dan Hart introduced our guest speaker, Steve Bennett, from PACE Ambulance Service. Steve said he joined PACE 14 years ago and is now one of three shift leaders. PACE currently has 45 full and part time employees. It was established in the early 1990's based on the need to develop emergency medical services in the Oxford Hills area. PACE also serves as the 911 go to for 8 communities and they also provide back-up paramedics for other communities. Stephens Memorial Hospital has been very supportive through the years. They currently run 6 ambulances and have 2-3 available as back-up when others are out of service for maintenance and so on. Steve is one of three supervisors who work 24 hour shifts, 8:00 AM to 8:00 AM.

As far as Covid-19 is concerned, the Oxford Hills has been very fortunate so far. While we have had a few positive cases, no one has needed to be hospitalized. PACE has received PCP devices from the Maine CDC which has been very helpful.

PACE is also one of the few services that have what is known as a Lucas device. This is a machine that does chest compressions for CPR in a consistent manner and does not get tired like a person does. They are very pleased to have these machines.
