Kristin gave a brief history of her background and how she came to be Executive Director. The Progress Center was incorporated in 1980. It currently serves 200 families and has 110 employees. The Center offers value based services including employment, a day program and a residential program. They strive to provide the highest possible level of

independence for their clients. Last October, they opened their community kitchen where they offer free community dinners four times a month, serving as many as 120 people each time. Their goal is to increase this to three dinners per week.

<u>Visiting Rotarians and guests:</u> PDG Jim Lilley from Gloucester Point, NJ was our only visiting Rotarian. Jim has been a summer visitor for many years and it was great to see him again. Carson Armstrong was the guest of his dad, Rob Armstrong.
