Dave Preble - Rotary made history today as it is the 30th Anniversary of Polio Plus. When Rotary started this campaign in 1985, there were 150,000+ cases of polio in 122 countries. In 2015, there are been 27 cases reported, a decline of 99.9%.

Since the casino opened, their market share and revenue have consistently increased each year. There are now 400 employees with good jobs and full benefits. 30%-40% of their market comes from northern Cumberland county. 50% if their total revenue, not net profit, goes to the state. Jack said that it has been a constant struggle to keep the Maine legislature from authorizing more casinos in the state. If a new casino were to open in Scarboro, for example, it would devastate Oxford as 50% of their market share would disappear over night.
