



## Last Week's Program:

Our guest speaker was Barbara Deschenes, a vibrant cancer survivor who talked to us about the Maine Cancer Foundation's Tri for the Cure. The Tri consists of a 1/3 mile swim, a 16 mile bicycle ride and a 5k run. In its 7 year history, it has raised \$7 million dollars. All of the money raised stays in Maine and is given out in grants to research scientists, hospitals and others. This year, 1440 women competed and raised \$1.4 million dollars. There were 17,000 donors with participants from 22 states, 16 being the youngest and 76 the oldest. Barbara talked about her personal story and how she got involved with the Tri.
