



President Christina — we received a letter from Maureen Howard from Kiwanis thanking us for joining the Kiwanians on the Songo River Queen cruise. She also said she was sorry she would not be able to attend the Lobster & Steak Fest but enclosed a \$50 contribution. Thank you, Maureen. She also invited us Rotarians to join her at her table for the Kiwanis Mystery Dinner Theater at Granite Ridge on September 6th at 7:00PM. Tickets are \$50 per person and dinner choices are steak, chicken or linguini. Chris also said that TD Bank would have a table and club members were welcome to sit there as well. PP Patty Rice suggested that it would be nice if we could get enough members to go and have our own table.

<u>President Christina</u> also brought the new <u>By-laws</u> to the club for discussion and approval. Dave Preble moved to accept them and was seconded by Lois Strauss. There was some discussion concerning the word "discretion" in Article 2 under the make-up of the Board which was clarified by PDG Marie Williams and PDG George Rice. There was also some discussion about the voting rights of past presidents at board meetings. Provisions allowing for past presidents to vote at board meetings were included in the initial revision of the By-laws but on concerns we were not following Rotary International guideline, that language was stricken form the final revision. The club voted to approve the By-laws as written on Dave's motion.

<u>Ron</u> – Lottery Raffle ticket sales are way down compared to last year at this time. We are only \$325 to the good so far but will be selling tickets until the time of the drawing Saturday evening at the Lobster & Steak Fest. Last year, we made \$2,000 on the raffle so hopefully we sold more tickets last Saturday.

Patty — a big thank you to the Oxford Casino for purchasing 100 tickets for the nursing homes again this year.

<u>George</u> – ticket sales for the LSF are down from last year. To date, we have sold 213 lobster tickets and 70 steak tickets so we will be ordering 300 lobsters and 100 steaks. Last year, we had 40 walk-ins for lobster and 21 for steak, so we should have some breathing room. The 213 sold includes the 100 purchased by the Casino and 58 purchased by Grover Gun Drilling.

Lobster & Steak Fest Update: The LSF went off without a hitch on Saturday. We were much more organized than in years past; pretty much everything but the corn was ready by 10:00 Saturday morning. The chairs and tables were set, the serving line was set, watermelon sliced and cookers ready. We had everything ready for the nursing homes at 3:30 so getting meals ready for them was not a problem once we opened to the public. Business was steady from the time we opened until 6:00PM. There were hardly any breaks at all. However, we did not serve any meals after 6:00 PM. We ran out of clams and came close to running out of fries. Everything was washed, dried, cleaned up and put away by 8:00 PM, also earlier than usual. I don't have numbers as I write this but I am sure Pat will have preliminary numbers at the meeting this morning.
