



Rotary Moment — Jack gave us an update on recent developments in Polio. In May, the Director-General of the World Health Organization (WHO) declared the international spread of polio a Public Health Emergency of International Concern and issued a set of recommendations to all polio impacted countries. On July 31, the Director General reassessed the situation and as a result, declared polio remains a public health emergency. Rotary supports the WHO Director-General's decision to keep these recommendations in place for travelers to and from Pakistan, Syria, Equatorial Guinea, Cameroon, Afghanistan, Ethiopia, Iraq, Israel, Somalia and Nigeria.

He talked about his interest in youth and how the number of activities we support and participate in for youth was one of the things that attracted him to Rotary. He talked about his acceptance of the Youth Services Chair and his plans for the future. He also talked about US Cellular's "Calling All Teachers" program. US Cellular is working with DonorsChoose.org to support K-12 public school teachers with \$1,000,000 in grants. Teachers must register as a US Cellular teacher on DonorsChoose.org then from August 11 to September 21, registered public school teachers can post a project. Teachers within a US Cellular retail foot print are eligible for funding. One project valued between \$100 and \$1,000 per teacher will be considered. He gave a couple of examples of teachers in Hebron and Westbrook who received grants so this is not just a program for big cities. If you know of any teachers in the Oxford Hills district who have an idea but no money to fund it, please tell them about this opportunity.
