Last Week:

President Lynne Schott led us in the Pledge, the 4 Way test and the Rotary prayer. We have been asked not to sing as it is not allowed under current CDC guidelines, so our voices are on hold until further notice.

Tina Fox introduced Maureen Howard and Barbara Murphy from Gardeners Growing Healthy Communities. Barbara started off by thanking us for our donations the last two years. The original purpose of GGHC was to provide fresh produce to those who don't otherwise have access to it. When GGHC started, they were serving about 12 people/families per week. This year, they have been serving upwards of 100 people per week. While they still serve a number of senior citizens, they are now seeing more working families. They have two sites, one in South Paris on land donated by the Oxford Hills Law Office on Route 26, and the other in Rumford on land donated by the paper mill. GGHC has 12-15 volunteers and they operate for about 10 weeks per year. Because of COVID restrictions, they are transporting the food to the 1st Congregational Church in South Paris where people can drive through and receive their produce. They don't have room to grow everything – especially produce that takes a lot of room or extra care, so with donations like ours, they purchase potatoes, corn, tomatoes and other things from Cooper's Farm in West Paris. Lastly, GGHC is always looking for more volunteers if anyone is interested.
