All their projects are self-funded as Rotarians there are the ones with good jobs and incomes. Their club meetings are not time constrained

and can last up to 3 hours. The host club there is always working on projects for potable water, sanitation, food insecurity and music! Dick's Portland club is currently helping with the establishment of a library. Public image is big in the Philippines with Rotary signs everywhere. Ariel Jersey also spoke of a project he is working on which is to upgrade a Rotary Training Center for automotive repair, welding and the leisure industry as those areas are where the good paying jobs are. All in all, it was a very informative and interesting presentation.
