Ron Morse announced that we are planning on selling Cabot Cheddar Cheese wheels again this year. Each wheel has the Rotary logo on it and makes a great gift.

Program Lobster/Steak Feed Review

Dave Preble moderated our discussion of the 2012 Lobster Feed. He announced that we grossed almost \$8800 and expects that we'll net about \$4000.

Dave opened the discussion for <u>Promotion</u>. The following ideas were discussed.

- (1) Why are we printing tickets with stubs unless we do something with the stub such as a raffle? The stubs have been available for accountability issues but haven't been used that way. Perhaps we should collect email addresses on the stub and start a database so we can remind previous ticket holders that new tickets are available.
- (2) We could print lobster on the red tickets and steak on the tan tickets because we found that some people, when they turned in their tickets, did not realize that they had already made a choice.
- (3) Patty Rice's weekly press releases were a great help with promotion.
- (4) Facebook and Radio advertising were also helpful.
- (5) Sending letters to businesses is helpful if followed up with a phone call. We need to do that at least a month before the event.
- (6) It would be nice to have a banner at all our events showing some of the many ways we use funds which we raise.
- (7) We might want to include entertainment in our promotion of the event including printing that fact on the posters and tickets.

Next we discussed <u>Equipment and Set-Up</u>. (1) Most thought the set-up went well, but we could have used more volunteers.

(2) Renting the cookers from the Greenwood Fire Dept has worked out well.

Next we discussed the <u>Event</u> itself. (1) Folks liked the music and many suggested inviting them back next year.

- (2) There was a problem with French fries getting backed up. We may need an additional cooker to solve that.
- (3) Some clams were gritty even though they had been thoroughly washed. Perhaps we should substitute clam chowder or consider a different supplier for the clams.
- (4) People liked the steak, but many were overcooked. We need a way to let the servers know which steaks are rare, med. or well done. Perhaps the servers need to cut into each steak. Since they continue to cook after removal from the grill, they should probably should all be cooked rare and only cooked longer as required by orders.
- (5) Corn seemed overcooked.

(6) We need to make sure everyone gets silverware.

Last we discussed <u>Cleanup</u>. The main issue here was that we needed more people involved in clean up. Using local Scouts and Interact kids to help with tables and chairs could help a lot. More of us need to plan on staying late for cleanup.
