<u>Visiting Rotarians and Guests</u>: We had two visiting Rotarian, Peter Kaurup from Crescent City, Florida and our formerly own Frank Shorey (Ray's Frankie) from Murdock Rotary in Port Charlotte, Florida. Becky Kaurup was the guest of Peter Kaurup.

Last week:

<u>President Chris</u> led us in the pledge and reading the Four-Way Test. Dan Allen led us in singing the second verse and chorus of Home on the Range. Glenn Huntley gave the blessing.

The first announcement from President Chris was that Rachel Brown has resigned from the club. Due to a promotion and more job responsibilities, she felt that she would not have the time to participate in the manner that she would like. Louise Campbell has agreed to assume the post of treasurer. Thank you for stepping in, Louise.

At its last meeting, the board decided that we would "pass the hat" for Texas at our meeting for two weeks. We did so last week and raised nearly \$400. The board agreed that the club would match the amount donated up to \$1000. We can also donate through the Foundation which has set up a mechanism for doing so. <u>George Rice</u> – proposed an idea for a new fund raiser that came from the Lobster & Steak Fest road show at the Veteran's Home. As we are looking to increase the number of scholarships that we give out as well as the dollar amount (per Visioning), George is proposing that we sell raffle tickets with the winner receiving a Lobster Fest for 10-12 people at a site of their choosing within 50 miles of Norway/South Paris. The ticket price would be \$30 and we would sell a maximum of 50 tickets. We would need four Rotarians to put on the event and we could make \$1000-\$1500 for each. We would provide and cook Lobster, corn, fries, clams, watermelon and drink and would set the food out for self-service. We also could go out to other clubs in the District and perhaps hire ourselves out to local businesses for employee gatherings.

<u>Stan Brett</u> – as the Lions Club used to collect old eye glasses, the question of what to do with them has come to us. We do not collect them but there are different places in area towns where they can be dropped off. Dr. Farmer has a collection box as does Hannaford.

We have the last scheduled tent rental sets coming up on September 15 and September 22. If you can help, please let Stan know.

<u>Tina Fox</u> – Interact will be collecting hats, mittens, socks, etc. for the five Head Start centers in the school district. It's no longer called Head Start but we couldn't think of the name.

<u>AG Chris Summers</u> – more discussion about what and how to keep track of our volunteer hours. It has been decided that this is too much for Stan to keep track of so we will have a binder with a page for each of us to put down our "time" each week. President Chris will monitor and prepare his report to the DG from this.

Per our Visioning work, there will be a Club Size and Composition meeting on Thursday, September 14th from 5:30 PM to 6:30 PM. Place to be announced next (this) week.
