Greeter George Rice updated us on Polio. Polio Plus started in 1985 and was expanded in 1988. Since then the number of polio cases has dropped by 99.9%. Rotary has helped to raise \$2.9 billion dollars and has vaccinated 3 billion kids. Rotary is now looking to fund Polio Plus with \$50 million annually. World Polio Day is October 24th.
