Last Week:

<u>President Chris,</u> with the assistance of sponsor **<u>Christina Twitchell,</u>** inducted the Anderson-Staples Post 112, Oxford American Legion as our newest member. This is a unique meeting of two organizations with similar goals and objectives and we are all looking forward to a great relationship.

Our guest speaker was *Rebecca LaBranche*, Laboratory Director of A & L Laboratories in Auburn, ME. A & L is the premier private water testing company in Maine, competing mostly with the Maine State Laboratory in Augusta. A & L does water testing of all types for all water sources – dug wells, drilled wells, points and artesian. They also do testing for Radon. The two major areas of concern are Radon and arsenic although uranium is coming to the fore front as well. For Arsenic 3 and Arsenic 5, it is recommended that water be tested annually with the more comprehensive test done every 3-5 years. Radon is in the air as well as water and because "events" can alter the circumstances, it is recommended that a property be tested annually. Lead is another issue and although it has not been used for plumbing since 1986, it can be a problem in homes built before that time and a home should be tested even if the water comes from a municipal water system.

Easino purchased for local nursing home. Beth was happy that when she went to the Casino for invoices for the food we purchased for the Lobster Feed through them, they only charged us for the steaks. They did not charge us for the fries, butter and other supplies. Lynne had a sad dollar for school starting next week and her inability to make many meetings during the school year.
