## Did you know: Uncle Sam Day

Although this is a week late, September 13 is designated as Uncle Sam Day. One of America's most recognized symbols, Uncle Sam, is linked to Samuel Wilson, a meat packer from Troy, NY, who supplied barrels of beef stamped "U.S." to the Army during the War of 1812. Soldiers referred to it as "Uncle Sam". The moniker spread and eventually caught on. In 1961, the U.S. Congress issued a resolution recognizing "Uncle Sam" Wilson, and authorizing a monument in his home town. Congress made Uncle Sam Day official in 1989.
