Last Week's Program:

Dave Preble was program chair Chris Weston's guest speaker. Dave has been very involved in the new drug task force in Oxford Hills. Heroin is a growing problem and there have been 2 deaths of young people from over dosing in the last 3-4 weeks. Generally, the addiction starts with other drugs and builds to heroin which is dangerous in any way it is taken. He has noticed an uptick in the sales of syringes at his store and in talking with local EMTs, he reports that they have had an increase in the number of drug related calls for help. Paris acting police chief, Jeff Lang set up the initial meeting in August with the local medical and law enforcement community. The result was the formation of the Western Maine Addiction Task Force. There are currently 36 people on the task force and they had their third meeting on September 23rd. They are starting a community wide advertising campaign to get the word out and they have met with OHCHS principal, Ted Moccia, and other school officials. The primary goals are to raise awareness, more treatment options, provide support help and working on legislation to provide drug courts, grant money and develop other resources. Anyone who is interested in attending meetings and getting involved is welcome.
