<u>At the Rice's –</u> a group of us got together at George and Patty's after the Lobster & Steak Fest to discuss the event and we came up with the following items which I thought I would share:

- 1. We need something better for corn storage after husking suggested that we buy more totes just for corn.
- 2. Use the large wedding tent instead of the two blue & gold tents.
- 3. We ordered 50 dozen corn; had a lot left over so should cut back to 45 dozen.
- Still need to plan an event for the Veteran's home since they could not participate on the 20<sup>th</sup>. (now set for Sept. 10)
- 5. Suggested that we make the lobster tickets red and the steak tickets blue sometimes people are confused by blue lobster tickets.
- 6. Decided that 3-6 works better than 4-7, or perhaps we should just cut back to 4-6 as some people felt 3 was too early. Closing down at 6 allowed us to finish clean-up in daylight and an hour earlier (obviously) than in the past. Didn't seem like such a long day.
- 7. Need to make sure posters and publicity have the right time.
- 8. We need some new coolers. The ones we use are getting pretty beat up.
- 9. Definitely need to put out a thank-you advertisement to vendors Dead River, Josh Tice, Casino, Smedbergs, etc. (has been done)
- **10.** Everyone was pleased with the % of Rotarians participating. Highest ever.
- 11. We should have some fire extinguishers and first aid kits specifically for burns. Beth will talk with Fred Curtis.
