<u>President Chris</u>—Two road tolls have been scheduled, one of which that was already on the schedule, October 18 for Special Olympics. The second will now be on November 8 for the food pantries. This is the one that was originally scheduled for August 16.

President Chris and Patty Rice met with Kiwanis on Friday, August 28, to discuss issues related to the storage trailers and tents. It turns out that the Kiwanis Club purchased the two storage trailers and agreed to let us use one in exchange for their using two of our tents for their pancake breakfast.
