I know I was surprised last week when Bob passed out the sign-up sheet as I'm sure others were. When he originally told me the dates, I put them in the calendar for October 16th and November 14th. I thought November was a bit late but didn't question it. I think if we had had more notice for September 12th, we would have had enough people sign up to hold it.

Last Week:

Co-President Peter led us in the Pledge and the 4-Way Test. Glenn Huntley gave the blessing.

Our guest speakers were Kari Taylor and Glenn Gordon from the Western Maine Addiction and Recovery Initiative, also known as WMARI. Kari is the new Project Co-ordinator. The Western Maine Addiction Recovery Initiative formed in 2015 in response to the crisis of substance use disorders. The group is made up of community members and professionals from many backgrounds, including social services, behavioral health, law enforcement, the legal and faith-based communities and more. Meetings are open to all, and take place on the first Wednesday of each month at 6:00 (currently via Zoom due to COVID-19 safety precautions). Their Mission Statement is: "We will build a collaborative, non-judgmental environment to support addiction recovery through education, advocacy, and compassionate community action." The tenants of the Initiative are 1) everyone deserves recovery, 2) stigma is a barrier to recovery, 3) the language we use has a roll in stigma and reduces recovery, 4) improving understanding and educating the public helps recovery, 5) addiction impacts all of us. 504 people died from overdoses in Maine in 2020, which was a 42% increase over 2018. There is an upcoming Recovery Rally this month with a march from Longley Square in Norway to Moore Park in South Paris, where there will be a BBQ, speakers and activities. WMARI will also have their Annual Conference on December 1st with presentations and speakers.

Glenn Gordon told us he has been drug free for 13 years. Recovery is possible but stigma is one of the biggest reasons people don't seek recovery. He also told us that isolation caused by COVID 19 led to more drug abuse.
