Program Chair Tally Decato introduced our guest speaker, Zizi Vlaun, General Manager of the Fair Share Co-op in Norway. Fair Share started in a barn in South Paris back in 1978, then moved to West Paris, to Tannery St. in Norway, and thanks to then Town Manager, Dave Holt, to their current location on Main St. in Norway in 1999. Zizi told us she has been a member of the co-op for 20 years and has been general manager for the last 2. There are currently 500 members in the co-op but that you don't need to be a member to shop in the store. The cost to join is \$75 and that is for a life-time membership. The Co-op owns the building they are located in and they currently have 5 businesses and 3 non-profits renting space.

They currently have 10 employees and everyone is making at least \$15 per hour. The Co-op will have sales of almost \$1M this year. It is important to note that they will price match any of their competition in the area and that they can order anything you can purchase at Whole Foods.
