Last week:

President Chris led us in the Pledge of Allegiance and the Four Way Test. In the absence of Dan Allen, Lois Strauss led us in singing "America the Beautiful". Glenn Huntley gave the blessing.

After the announcements, President Chris introduced DG Dave Underhill who gave a great talk on the "Pyramid of Peace" and the elements that bring it to life. The strength of Rotary is at the local club level. It's what we do every day in our communities that bring Rotary to life. The second thing is that Rotary is a "peace organization." We all work to improve the lives of those around us and stabilize our communities. The elements of the "Pyramid" are disease prevention, water quality, healthy moms and kids, literacy and community development. When all of these elements are in harmony, we have a peaceful community no matter where we are in the world. DG Dave then went on to talk about the Rotary Recovery Initiative that we heard about last week from Bob MacKenzie from the Kennebunk Rotary. We need to consider what we can do as a club to do a little piece of the Initiative and our working with the Western Maine Addiction Recovery Initiative is a way to accomplish this goal.

Dave then went on to talk about 5 topics or goals for the coming Rotary year.

- 1) He asked the club to keep track of our accomplishments and the time we spend on each
- 2) Angst about membership every club is dealing with this. Why do people not join Rotary? There are three major reasons (a) "don't have the time" which really means we don't see the value of serving, so we need to invite people to help us with projects so they see the value first hand. (b) it's too expensive and to a degree, that is true. The cost is up to each club, so keep that in mind when setting dues and so on. (c) people don't get asked so ask.
- 3) Dave thanked us for our contributions to Rotary and asked us to keep up the good work. Our donations came to an average of \$162 per person last year.
- 4) Consider joining the Bequest society leave something in your will to Rotary so that what you have done will continue in some small way.
- 5) Maine needs more trees! We will be getting one tree for each member to plant next spring.

After Dave's talk, President Chris presented him with a check for a \$100 donation to the Foundation in his name, two t-shirts and a guest speaker coffee mug. AG Chris then led us in singing our "Coffee Mug" song to Dave and Linda. I must say, Chris has an excellent singing voice that he has been hiding from us for all these years.

<u> Happy Dollars</u> — Time was short, so we only had a couple of happy dollars. <u>Frank Shorey</u> was happy to find out that the District Governor was a closet Tampa Bay Rays fan. <u>Kim</u> had a thank you dollar for the card and gifts, and a happy dollar for continuing her Rotary career in Auburn.
