They are part of a Rotary team that brings new and used hearing aids, as well as solar chargers to recharge the batteries of the hearing aids they fit the hearing impaired. In addition, they provide speech therapy to supplement the hearing aid fittings and distribute speech therapy materials for the non-verbal patients.

Our members and guests were enlightened by Rich Pattenaude, Chancellor of the University of Maine System with its seven campuses. Rich reminded us that when he last visited Portland Rotary, several years ago, he held the position of President of University of Southern Maine.

Change Happens and "Fine" is the new four letter F bomb in the system. Fine is faint unacceptable praise for the changes Rich is bringing to his commitment to the mission of the University. Pattenaude's principal vision is that the University system should work to make Maine's economy stronger. In spite of the challenges of a seven percent workforce reduction, and budget cuts, Rich has created and maintained a strategic investment fund of two million dollars. Our legislators could learn a thing or two from the non-state agency over which Rich presides.
