THIS WEEK, CINDY BUTTS, "REALTY CHECK"

This coming Friday, we will be hearing from a veteran realtor and leader of a powerful association who will give us the inside scoop on the always fluctuating housing market here in Maine.

The good news in Maine is that the median selling price is up almost 1% statewide and 4% locally from a year ago (to \$166,500 in Maine...\$225,000 in Cumberland County). The bad news is that the number of houses sold is down over 20% in the past year (even higher, 24%, here in greater Portland). But, Maine's home sales statistics are better than those of the New England Region, which shows a 24.4% unit home sales decrease in the past year. Of course, the mortgage rates continue to be low so it is a great time to buy. And, the economy is getting better...right?

Well, on Friday, we will attack some of these numbers and attempt to figure out where the real estate market is trending. The Portland Rotary Club will welcome Cindy Butts, the CEO of the Maine Association of REALTORS, a position she has held for the past 23 years. She is also the CEO of the Maine Real Estate Information System, a statewide multiple listing service based in South Portland. Prior to moving to Maine, she worked in both the Chicago and Washington, DC offices of the National Association of REALTORS. She graduated from George Washington University and has received numerous industry designations and awards. Cindy will be discussing the real estate market in Maine, and the challenges presently facing the real estate industry. So join us this Friday for what should prove to be an informative and eye-opening discussion.

With 81% of voters rejecting the status quo, the house and senate (as well as the executive office) must first look at the economy, then health reform, and then the public perception that those in power (both nationally and in Augusta) live by a differing set of rules than John Q. Public. Knowing that if Maine spent along the line of the national state average, we could save over one billion dollars per year, there may be hope that we can perhaps fully fund the state pension system, which is now owed \$4.4 billion, and pay back stock market losses that have fallen well above \$2 billion, as we find ways to cut the fat and consolidate where needed. Tony's group has suggested we cut back on the size of our legislature, with each member now representing 8700 constituents, (compared with the national average of 56,000), reduce the length of the sessions by 50%, and set up a lifetime term limit of 12 years. These recommendations, as well as the ongoing discussions of consolidation of county and town governments, consolidation of the U Maine system and an openness to accepting a diverse business culture to replace our aging business ideals, could allow for some significant and perhaps immediate changes and savings in our ongoing effort to eliminate state debt and encourage economic growth.

With Maine consistently at the bottom of the New England fiscal ladder, and in the depths on all national polls, it is time to bring about change. The voters have demanded it. So talk to your legislator, get involved, and let's move forward!
