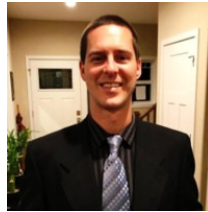

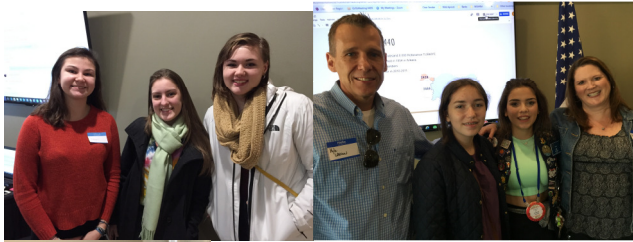

Rotary Youth Exchange



Youth Exchange, We do it Right

On March 25, Thom Weiss, the club's Youth Exchange Officer (YEO), described the club's exchange program. Sarah Flanagan is the Youth Exchange Counselor, and Rhea Myers is the Youth Protection Officer.

The most recent outbound students were Isabel to Colombia in 2018; Daniel to Denmark 2017; Mason to Thailand in 2015. Daniel, currently at UW, has a sister who will be the 2019 outbound to Sweden. Mason, currently at UW, has been accepted to the U of Hawaii.

The recent inbounds are Su from Turkey, 2018; Bea from Brazil 2017; Francy from Italy, 2016; Jasmine from Taiwan, 2015; Xaver from Austria, 2014; and Sari from Finland 2013.

Every year we ask the exchange students for their bucket list of places they would like to visit or do while here. Jasmin's bucket list was to go fishing, eat steak, fly a kite, milk a cow, and visit a cheese factory.

Next year's first and second host families have been arranged, and the third is in the works. A main duty of the YEO is to gain the commitment of the high school about 1 ½ years in advance. Middleton High School accepts 6 exchange students a year; they used to have 10 to 12 a year. The host families must take orientation

and training. The rules and regulations change every year. The cost to the club for an inbound student is about \$5000 a year.

Our thanks to hardworking Thom Weiss who not only has been the YEO of the club this year, but is also the manager of the book project.
