Scott Spoolman – The Ancient History of Devil’s Lake

Summary by Scott Spoolman

On April 5, Scott Spoolman told of the fascinating history of Devil’s Lake. In his presentation, Scott talked about basic concepts of Wisconsin’s geology, such as the great span of time involved—billions of years—and the fact that, because of the movement of continental plates over time, the Wisconsin region was near the equator for much of its history. He then took us on a virtual tour of Devil’s Lake State Park to show how geological events and processes shaped the landscape. Those events and processes included mountain-building, invasions by ancient inland oceans, eons of erosion, and the arrival of crushing glaciers. The result was a jewel of a lake surrounded by fascinating rock formations and nestled in a gorge formed by ancient walls of ice.
