Sara Pickard, Executive Director of Girls on the Run, enthusiastically told the club on April 9 about this 10 week program in the spring and fall for girls in the 3rd to 8th grade. Sara, who is in the banking industry, said that this is more than a running program. Their mission is to inspire girls to be healthy, joyful, and confident. Girls on the Run is a physical activity-positive youth development program.

Girls on the Run, which uses trained coaches, was started in 1996 in North Carolina so girls don't go into the "girl box" later on. The program is now in all 50 states. It was founded in 2004 in South Central Wisconsin. The 10 week curriculum aims to inspire confidence, caring, character, connection competition, and contribution.
