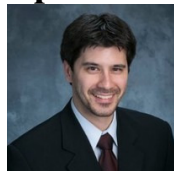

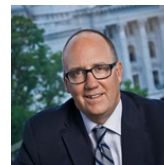

## The Dane County Jail System

The Dane County jail is actually three buildings, Rev. Christa Fisher, the Dane County jail chaplain described on March 26. The old jail is the top 2 floors of the City County building. It has long dark corridors filled with cages for minimum to maximum security. The second building is a minimum security building – the Public Service Building on Doty Street. It has a large room in which the inmates circulate. The third building is the Fair Center where people have release privileges. Women are in the City County building in one wing. There are about 80 women there a day.

Over the year, 16,000 are incarcerated; 900 at one time. The average stay is 30 days. Jail is supposed to be temporary. Rev. Fisher spends time with those in for 30 days to 2 years. She works during the week and another chaplain works on the weekends.

A Catholic priest is in charge of the entire community and tends to the spiritual needs of the people. Rev. Fisher helps people have hope and also serves the families and staff. She sometimes helps them find housing and resources in the community. The jail staff provides support groups that are not grounded in faith. Rev. Fisher serves both women

and men. The emotional needs of men and women are the same. Most have experienced trauma in childhood. Their ways of coping are with drugs and self destruction. They have post traumatic stress and personality disorders. We all have the same needs, she said, to be loved, heard, and seen.
