District Governor Bill Hoel's Visit to Madison Breakfast Rotary August 6

District Governor Bill Hoel met with Madison Breakfast Rotary's Board of Directors on August 6 at Vitense Golfland.

District Governor Bill Hoel, of LaCrosse and a Rotarian for 26 years, gave an inspiring talk to Breakfast Rotary on August 6. There are 35,000 clubs around the world and District 6250 has 62 clubs. The real work of Rotary is done in the clubs, Bill said. Polio is the biggest project. Polio will be considered eradicated when we go 3 years without a trace of polio, not 3 years without a case of polio. The Bill and Melinda Gates foundation has donated \$350 m for polio plus and still matches our donations 2 for 1. Safe water and hygiene are the next big projects. There are 2.3 billion people without sanitation. The goal is for sanitation and clean water for everyone in 12 years. Rotary works, Bill said. Rotary has a seat at the table at the UN and other organizations. Rotary has boots on the ground in 22 countries. Rotary is a team sport. *Our thanks to Bill Hoel for his visit to Breakfast Rotary and for his inspiring talk.*
