JustDane, Inc. Works With Individuals and Families Involved in the Criminal Justice System

At the January 6 meeting, Shar-Ron Bule, Associate Director of JustDane, addressed the club. JustDane helps transform individual lives and social systems to create a just and equitable community. JustDane was founded in 1971 as the Madison-area Urban Ministry (MUM), a social justice, social service organization. In 2020, the name was changed to JustDane to reflect their expanded reach.

JustDane is a private, 501 © 3 non-profit agency that offers an array of direct service programs for individuals and families involved in the criminal justice system. These services include prison reentry programs and services for children who have an incarcerated parent, community events designed to help people understand what it's like to walk in the shoes of someone newly released from prison, and jail and prison in-reach programs.

Among their initiatives are the following: **Just Bakerv** is an educational and vocational training program that works with individuals who are experiencing significant barriers to employment such as homelessness, justice problems involved, lack of education and a lack of work history of skills. The curriculum allows students to earn up to 15 college credits and gain acceptance into the Madison College Culinary Program. Students receive sales and marketing experience by working with program staff. **Healing House**, located in Madison, is an 8-bed facility, providing 24/7 recuperative care by medically-trained staff and volunteers for up to 28 days for homeless people needing medical care. Case management, provided by The Road Home Dane County, helps to end the cycle of homelessness and locate permanent housing. **Peer Support Specialists** are based on the premise that those peers who possess lived experience are better able to relate to the peers they work with through a sense of mutuality, having encountered similar challenges associated with mental health, substance use, and/or pre and post incarnation without power differential. Peer Support provides therapy

sessions, an Agricultural training program, housing placement and rent assistance,

employment services, additional training and education.

Just Connections matches youth affected by parental incarceration with a caring adult mentor.

Circles of Support are made of 5-6 volunteers from the community called Circle Members and one individual who has recently been released from an Institution called a Core Team member. **Journey Home** helps with food share eligibility, life skills training and employability and job placement assistance. *Our thanks to the staff of JustDane for their work in the community and for the presentation by Shar-Ron Bule.*
