# A Lot is Happening in Downtown Madison

Generation Z (18 to 34 year olds) is moving here. Jason Ilstrup, President of Downtown Madison, Inc., gave club members his annual update of the city on January 13, 2025. The downtown area has 40,000 residents – a 20 percent increase, and 9,000 new apartment units were built. The vacancy rate is two percent. There is not much building of apartment condos and thus the new apartments are mostly rentals.

Madison never overbuilt office space before Covid, and now downtown office space has seen a 12 percent recovery. There is some affordable housing being built, especially on the triangle and the area of the former St. John's church. There are many new hotels and restaurants and the university continues to build including the new Data Science building, the new Engineering building, the Irving and Dorothy Levy Residence Hall and the new football practice facility. Among the civics projects are the new History building, the Veterans Museum and the Lake Monona Waterfront.

The most dynamic area now is the Regent Street area with new housing and restaurants. Looking forward: Affordable student housing continues to be a difficult issue and needs to be addressed. The city needs more parks and better connection to the lakes. Passenger rail continues to be discussed – maybe by 2030.

Our thanks to Jason Ilstrup for his comprehensive view of all downtown Madison and for his presentation. Jason is the current president of the Downtown Rotary club.
