

More Leadership is Needed in Sports for Women

Girl's participation in sports and fitness has come a long way since Title 9, Alicia Pelton told the club on June 4. However, there are few women coaches or in sports leadership roles in Wisconsin. Sports have hidden health benefits for women. Sports participation results in fewer chronic illnesses, stronger bones and reduced risk of osteoporosis, Sports builds self confidence; girls do better in school; girls learn teamwork and sports builds self confidence. The private schools seem to have more sports opportunities for girls, especially the high school parochial schools. One problem is that unisex uniforms are not unisex.
