Club members brought the delicious food and enjoyed visiting in person for the first time in a long time with new members and former members Bill and Carol Dombroski. Eng has been secretary of the club for many years and Bill has been a main stay at the Books for the World project. The club has fond memories of the Holiday parties each year at the lovely home of Eng and Bill.

Racial Equity in the Wisconsin Health Care System

On June 7, Dr. Kathy Hartke discussed the racial bias that exists in medical care and especially the affect on maternal health. Racism is a serious threat to the public's health she said. Maternal mortality is rising in the U.S. as it declines elsewhere. Wisconsin has an overall health disparities grade of D, according to a recent study by the UW Population Institute of the UW School of Medicine and Public Health. Longstanding systemic health and social inequities have put many people from racial and ethnic minority groups at increased risk of getting sick and dving from COVID -19. Black Americans are 3X more likely to get infected and twice as likely to die. Wisconsin has the highest Black infant mortality rate in the nation, 3 times higher than white infants. Approximately 25 Wisconsin women die each year during or within one year of pregnancy. Pregnancyrelated mortality for non-Hispanic black mothers is 5 times the rate for non Hispanic white mothers. Accepting federal funds to expand Medicaid is central to our efforts to improve the health and well-being of all Wisconsinites, Dr. Hartke advises. States that

expanded Medicaid under the Affordable Care Act saw a 50 percent greater reduction in infant mortality than non expansion states. Dr. Hartke, a long time women's health advocate, has testified in County and Federal Courts as well as the Wisconsin State Legislature on behalf of access to Women's health care. She graduated from the Medical College of Wisconsin in 1983 and completed her OBGYN residency at Mount Sinai Medical center. She has served as the Co-chair of the Wisconsin Maternal Mortality Review Team and on the Wisconsin Prenatal Quality Collaborative.
