The Restorative Justice Project at UW Law **School and Community Engagement**

The Restorative Justice Project (RIP) was started in 2013 at the UW Law School to serve harmed parties in the aftermath of serious crimes. The Dialogue program offers the opportunity for harmed parties and their relatives to meet with and have questions answered by the responsible party who committed a crime against them. In the past decade, over 100 dialogues have been facilitated and more than 200 harmed parties have been served with the process. Prison lets people off the hook as they aren't obligated to answer victims' questions, listen to them, hear their pain and also express genuine remorse. Ouestions asked in a dialogue are: Who was harmed? How was that person harmed? What can be done to repair the harm? A study has shown significant satisfaction for victims and a 30% reduction in recidivating for criminals who go through the RI process.

The RI Project also introduces the Law students to RI practices in both prisons and the community. In addition to prison-based programming, students have the opportunity to address conflict and harm in neighborhoods and schools. Students take on leadership roles by collaborating with community groups, nonprofit organizations, and schools to craft restorative responses to crime, violence and other complex issues.

Our thanks to Jonathan Scharrer, Director of the Restorative Justice Project at the UW Law School for his valuable work in the community and for his presentation to Breakfast Rotary on March 11, 2024.
