Dane County Exec Joe Parisi Has Been Working on the County's Problems

Dane County Executive Joe Parisi outlined his many projects for the club on May 22. Project Suck the Muck keeps phosphorus from running into the lakes. On public health, he is concerned that under the new health plan, fewer people will be covered. On human services, he is working with the schools on mental health issues. Instead of schools turning to the police on mental health problems, now a county team will go to the schools. This pilot project has been very successful and is now used in 11 school districts. On homelessness, progress is being made with the new homeless service day center in the old Chamber of Commerce Building. Called the Beacon, it was purchased for \$3 M by the city, county United Way and a coalition. Charities will help pay for the services. In addition, Project Big Step connects contractors with those wanting work.

Our thanks to Joe Parisi for his very informative talk to the club and for his important work to better the county. Bruce Harville arranged this program.
