

The International Committee

Breakfast Rotary's impact is global!

On November 9, Gary Muldoon, chair of the club's International Committee, outlined the club's present projects and plans for the future. Current projects are the Zapote water project in Guatemala, the Kongoni Community Library in Kenya, and the Rotary Books for the World.

For the Zapote clean water project, an infrastructure was built to provide clean, chlorinated water to over 100 homes or 600 people. The project with a budget of \$55,593 was funded by a RI global grant and included money from our partners and contributing cubs. Madison Breakfast Rotary was the primary sponsoring club, with Stoughton Rotary a contributing club. Our partners were the Rotary Los Altos club in Guatemala, Engineers Without Borders, UW Chapter, and EWB, Guatemala chapter. The project was completed in September.



Students in Kenya

The Kongoni Community Library project in Kenya is being rebuilt with a district grant at a budget of \$14,500 made up of \$7,250 club contributions and a \$7,250 District grant. Our partner in Kenya is the Eldoret Rotary Club. Madison Breakfast Rotary is the sponsoring club and our partners were Madison East-Monona, Madison South, Stoughton, Waunakee and Madison Horizons. The project will help build and reopen the Kongoni Community Library after an order to vacate the rundown government building.

A future project bring considered is the funding for a prototype of a rural library in Guatemala. In partnership with Club Rotario Los Altos of Quetzaltenango, the project would place small libraries in rural Guatemalan schools. The estimated cost of the prototype is \$3,000 (non-prototype will be \$4,700). The Los Altos club has pledged \$1,000. A plan to reduce the cost of the

prototype is to collect and send books, computers, and interactive games to them. If successful, this could lead to a District or Global grant.

Thom Weiss is the director of the club's Rotary Books for the World for which books are collected, packed, and sent from a local warehouse. Regular reports are sent directly to the club.
