

The Environment Named Rotary's 7th Area of Focus

The following are now the 7 areas for Rotary's global support:

- 1. Peace building and conflict prevention;
- 2. Disease prevention and treatment;
- 3. Water, sanitation, and hygiene;
- 4. Maternal and child health;
- 5. Basic education and literacy;
- 6. Community economic development;.
- 7. The environment.

MBR's Impressive Club Service

On October 26, **Sara Sneider** presented an overview of the club's current service projects. With the club's focus on youth and literacy, our biggest programs have been Youth Exchange and the Books for the World. Unfortunately, Youth Exchange was stopped this year due to the pandemic. Books for the World collects, sorts, packs and ships books around the world. Books for the World continued, although COVID shut down school donations for a while. Thom Weiss reported that through the 3rd quarter they shipped one truckload of books that included desks and tables, receiving over 1000 boxes of books and over 300 volunteer hours. School districts are starting to clear out and books are picked up by Hallman Lindsay and delivered to the warehouse. The owner of Hallman Lindsay is a member of the Sun Prairie Rotary club. Paint trucks deliver paint all over the state and come back empty. They have offered to pick up books from schools and drop them off at the warehouse. Recently, a lady from a homeless shelter took some books for the shelter and the After Hours club is putting boxes of books in Laundromats. Books have also been delivered to prisons over the years. In addition, Thom has been working with the **Madison Reading Project** (MPR) which needed a place to unload books they order. MRP is trying to get new bigger space with a loading dock. We are a bridge for them. The club had been working with MRP one Monday meeting a month to sort, stamp and shelve their books, which they deliver to underserved students.

Mike Kafka reported that Meals-on-Wheels has a regular corps of drivers who deliver once a month and have continued in the pandemic. They could use backups. People leave coolers outside their doors for the meals. Meals-on-Wheels is now under Marquette Management Services, not Independent Living.

The **Special Olympics shot put,** coordinated for many years by **Mike Kafka**, was cancelled last May, but they are doing some on line competitions.

Betsy Nordstrom reported that **Project Home** which coordinates the Paint-A-Thon, also cancelled house painting this year, but Project

Home has contractors to repair homes. Others can hire them. **RYLA**, a conference for high school sophomores and juniors in May, was also cancelled this year.

Kevin Frost, brought us the **Guatemala Water Project**, which **Judy Levine** helped apply for a
Rotary Global grant. Next on their agenda is to
get people trained in hygiene and cleaning. **The Breakfast Rotary Foundation's grants**,
given out each year are coordinated by
foundation president **Bruce Harville**. The
grants are focused on youth and literacy.
