

The Wisconsin Medical Project

Dr. Bernard Micke, president of The Wisconsin Medical Project, addressed Breakfast Rotary on November 16. The Wisconsin Medical Project is a non profit organization that collects used and surplus medical equipment, refurbishes it and ships it to needy countries. The organization is funded by donations which pay for warehouse rent at \$1200 a month plus packing supplies and shipping costs. The project grew out of a 1999 trip to a sister city in Camagüey, Cuba. Most recently they have been shipping supplies to Cuba and to 7 countries in West Africa.

While Cuba has universal free access to health care and prevention and the quality of health care is high, their equipment is old and outdated, Dr. Micke said. The group visited a medical school in Camagüey and have sent equipment such as EKG machines, endoscopes, and wheelchairs.

In 1917, Bernard visited Senegal and traveled to rural clinics. Nurse midwives there provide much of the medical care and Dr. Micke put on a program of resuscitation. Of the west African countries, Sierra Leone is one of the poorest countries. Dr.
