enjoyed an inspiring visit from the very energetic District Governor Karen Hebert on October 4. Twenty seven years ago, the U.S. was declared polio free and one year ago, Africa was declared polio free. Now there are 2 cases, one in Afghanistan and one in Pakistan. Rotary continues to test people and the environment. If after 3 years of negative tests, we can declare the world polio free. The polio plus program has paved the way for other health eradications. Rotary moves forward despite the presence of conflict.

Rotary’s Days of Environmental Service in October is the beginning of Rotary’s new area of service, protecting the Environment.

Rotary’s seven areas of focus are: promoting peace, fighting disease, providing clean water

and sanitation, saving mothers and children, supporting education, growing local economies, and protecting the environment.
