

Zeteo Community Aids Victims of Human Trafficking



Marlene Sorenson, Executive Director of Zeteo Community

Marlene Sorenson, accompanied by her husband Kenton, described the work of Zeteo Community to the club on October 7. Sex trafficking is a very real problem, Marlene said. While it is often misunderstood as a problem that only happens in far-away places, it most certainly is not. Sex trafficking is happening everywhere, hiding in plain sight, even in our beloved city of Madison, Wisconsin. Sex trafficking is a 150 Billion dollar industry that is growing and occurs in all 72 counties of Wisconsin. Eighty percent of the recruiting occurs on social media. The mission of Zeteo is to serve women who have been sexually exploited by providing residential programming and a supportive community in which they are free to dream and thrive. Survivors say they need a safe environment and job training. Zeteo purchased land in 2022 with their first donation of \$200,000 on which they plan to build two residential houses, with house parents in each home, where satellite therapy and counseling are provided. This is an \$8 M project and Zeteo cannot take government funding. Zeteo Community is a 501c3 nonprofit organization. Gifts are tax deductible.
