CREATE HOPE in the WORLD

A few weeks ago at the District 7610 Awards and Installation event, my husband Bill and I were honored by PDG Sandy Duckworth and DRFC PDG Pat Borowski, alongside fellow Stafford Club members Leigh Ann and Jack Poland, for our contributions as Major Donors to The Rotary Foundation (TRF). It was an incredible honor to receive this recognition and it is a highlight in our mission of service. We stood shoulder to shoulder in that room with contributors of all levels to The Rotary Foundation and we were humbled to be counted among them.

Like many of you, when I joined Rotary, I paid my dues and gave a small stipend to The Rotary Foundation each quarter to help my club achieve a collective goal. After a few years and continued education about all that TRF accomplishes, we increased my donation to a larger, monthly stipend so I could become a Paul Harris Society (PHS) member (\$1000 commitment annually) and increase our global impact. When I accepted the nomination for District Governor (DG) in Jan 2021, we assessed and then increased our giving again, with the goal to become new Major Donors (\$10,000 collective contribution) as I stepped into the role of DG on Jul 1, 2023. I share my story to show that as our knowledge of The Rotary Foundation expanded, so did our giving, and I believe yours can too!

We have some fun opportunities to become involved in Foundation and Polio Fund giving this year! This will include a variety of sporting events for End Polio Now and an "End Polio Now Challenge!" Everyone can participate in the EPN Challenge and it will help your individual and club goals for giving. This will be an 'activity challenge' that will run until Oct 2023, ending on WORLD POLIO DAY Oct 24th! Best part? The 30 minute daily activities can be mental/self-care or physical (reading/crossword/sudoku or yoga/walking/running/ swimming). More information is coming soon and there will be a website provided for launching your individual or club challenge and collecting contributions.

To keep The Rotary Foundation strong we all need to contribute and participate where we can. The Foundation Seminar (Sept) and Foundation Recognition Event (Nov) are upcoming opportunities to participate, learn, and celebrate! We should also keep the Foundation in our heart and mind so when other organizations, friends, or family ask where they should make their contributions, The Rotary Founda-

tion is our first and natural response. We all know that many hands make light work, and Rotary is a force-multiplier by which so much work, in every corner of the globe, is possible. PDG JUANITA CAWLEY RECEIVES THE ROTARY FOUNDATION DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD

The Distinguished Service Award is The Rotary Foundation's highest recognition for continued exemplary support and leadership. Our district has had only three members recognized: PDG Travis White, PDG Chuck Davidson and PDG Sandy Duckworth. PDG Juanita Cawley was added to the honor roll of awardees this year at the annual District Recognition Banquet.

The presentation of The Rotary Foundation Distinguished Service Award is The Foundation Trustees highest and most prestigious recognition. Nominations for this award are restricted to 50 from Rotary's 1.3 million members annually. From these nominations, the Trustees select only the most outstanding for recognition. This year there were only 24 awardees.

Recipients of this distinguished award must have demonstrated a broad range of exemplary and continued service over an extended pe-

riod including having received The Rotary Foundation's Citation for Meritorious Service at least four years prior. This service must include at least six major accomplishments with substantial activity in each over the past two years.

PDG Juanita was cited as a dedicated leader, trainer, motivator, fundraiser and spokesperson for The Rotary Foundation. A few examples cited: served our district as Rotary Foundation Chair for four years – a year's extension rarely given to any district, established D7610 as a Global Peacebuilder District, led our district to four years as #1 in Zone Annual Fund/Per Capita giving, achieved first time district million-dollar TRF giving, held extensive TRF training opportunities at the district & zone levels, and has continued to provide a monthly TRF newsletter since 2015. And these just touch the surface of the service Juanita has provided to The Rotary Foundation, our Zone, and our District.

Past RI Director Peter Kyle from D₇6₂0 who was out of the country and could not attend in person but sent a congratulatory message.

It gives me great pleasure to join with you this evening in celebrating the conferring by the Trustees of TRF of the Distinguished Service Award on my good friend and classmate, Past District Governor, Juanita Cawley. This is a big deal! It is the highest award that the Trustees can bestow. Each year, the Trustees consider many Rotarians from all around the Rotary world for this award but only 24 were selected this year.

Juanita and I have had the good fortune to work alongside each other for the past 12 years. Although we are members of different Rotary Districts, I have witnessed firsthand her extraordinary commitment to the objectives of TRF. I have long admired her passion for peacebuilding. Early in her Rotary journey, she became a strong supporter of the Rotary Peace Centers program. Juanita remained actively engaged in promoting the peace agenda for D 7610, and helped lead the charter of the Rotary E-Club of Global Peacebuilders of which she has just completed a highly successful year as club president.

D7610 is extremely fortunate to have someone with Juanita's dedication, passion, and all-round professionalism in its ranks. She has earned the respect and admiration of her colleagues. Her selection as a recipient of TRF DSA is a well-deserved and fitting recognition for many years of distinguished service.

The recognition was concluded with the presentation of a hand-carved crystal and distinctive lapel pin. We are raising the roof on Polio Plus Awareness and Fundraising. We want to double the membership in our Polio-Plus Society and work with clubs on the PolioPlus fundraising projects that will work best for your clubs and communities. We appreciate that the goals noted above will not happen overnight. They are a journey for cubs and Rotarians. Collectively,

we are getting closer each year. Just look at our collective District Rotary Foundation results over the last two years. It is important that those among us who have made a commitment to donate to TRF annually, share what created this commitment in us and our path to give.

RY 2023/2024 Rotary Foundation & Governor's Citation Goals:

This RY DG Rene Laws and the District Foundation Team are excited about how much more progress YOU; our Clubs and Rotarian-Members have made and will make further this year. The best way to achieve is to have goals to which we aspire.

So, our Governor requests that at a minimum each club strive to achieve:

ROTARY GLOBAL GRANT SCHOLARSHIPS For Academic Year 2024-2025 by Chris Elliott Global Grants Chair (<u>cwe@virginia.edu</u>)

Scholarships The Virginia Rotary District 7610 is pleased to announce that <u>Rotary</u> <u>Global Grant Scholarships</u> are now open for application to all clubs in the

District 7610. All clubs will now assist scholarship applicants from within the District for consideration for this \$40,000 scholarship to pursue graduate study outside of the United States. The Global Grant Scholarships are designated for dedicated individuals who are committed to addressing global challenges in one of Rotary's seven areas of focus: Peace and Conflict Prevention/Resolution, Disease Prevention and Treatment, Water and Sanitation, Maternal and Child Health, Basic Education and Literacy. Economic and Community Development. Supporting the Environment.

Scholarships will be awarded for *graduate study in a degree program* to individuals who demonstrate commitment to community service and excellent leadership skills and with a proven track record in their field of study or vocation. For the 2024-25 academic year we anticipate two scholarships in the range of \$40,000 from Rotary District 7610 will be awarded.

Candidates must travel abroad for study, live in a foreign host Rotary district while studying, and must either be proficient in the language of the host country or study in a graduate degree program taught in English in their host country. Rotary Global Grant Scholarships are funded by Rotary District 7610 funds matched by The Rotary International Foundation.

The selection of scholarship recipients is a multi-tiered process starting with the candidates' local club, which seeks to identify qualified individuals who are students or permanent residents within their service area. Applicants are advised to adhere to the following general timeline:

• July 1

Application form available here

- Late September Application deadline, submitted to local Rotary Club sponsors
- Early October Local interviews with Rotary Club sponsors (if needed)
- October 20 Local clubs submit their nominees to District 7610
- November 10 District nominee interviews in Charlottesville, VA (or zoom if required)
- November 20 Deadline for communicating District decisions to all applicants
- November 26 Applicants apply for admission to their planned institution by this date
- January 15 Selected candidates submit proof of acceptance into their program at host institution abroad
- March 15 Anticipated date for final confirmation of award from Rotary International

Additionally, applicants are encouraged to review the <u>Global Grant Terms and Conditions</u> to seek answers to eligibility or other questions, and you may <u>reference this guide</u> from a previous scholar for helpful tips on considering this opportunity and writing your application materials.

Applications, along with a copy of your transcript and resume/CV must be submitted to the candidates' <u>local Rotary Club within District 7610</u> - if you have been admitted to a graduate program already, please include a copy of your letter of admission. Prospective candidates seeking support from local clubs should contact the Club President using the link above.

What can we do to get started? Enter your clubs' goals into Rotary Club Central. We currently have only 47.2% of our clubs with their goals entered in the system. If you need assistance, contact your Assistant Governor for help.

It is critical that your goals are entered so we can make a plan to achieve them. When goals are not set, the annual giving is lower. Also, important to note, is that annual giving amounts directly impact our District Designated Fund (DDF) amount. This year, we were able to increase our district grant amount from \$1800 to \$2300 per club and we would love to be able to do so again in the coming years. 





- Wild polio cases remained unchanged at 6 for this calendar year-to-date, compared to a month ago. The 6 cases are all geographically close together and have a common genetic source, reminding us that the polio virus pays no attention to international boundaries.
- Vaccine-derived cases continue to increase, although at a slower rate than the previous three years. With a very few exceptions (3 in Indonesia; 1 in Israel), all are in African countries where the level of protection is relatively low. The reduction in rate may be attributed to use of the more genetically stable vaccine.
- Once again, Rotarians worldwide contributed over \$50M toward eradicating polio for Rotary year 2022-23, leaving none of the Gates Foundation's 2-for-1 match unused on the table. Based on near-final giving data for the year, our own District 7610 and its Rotarians contributed \$50,000 in District Designated Funds to polio, a record total, and \$109,833 in cash to polio, a 12.2% increase over the previous Rotary year. Only 5 of its clubs did not make a polio donation from any of its members. It was a good year!
