Rotary began empowering communities to access grants and other resources, embracing local solutions, and spurring innovation in an effort to address the causes and reduce the effects of climate change and environmental degradation.

Rotary members began tackling environmental issues the way they always do: by coming up with projects, using their connections to change policy and planning for the future.

As Rotary engages in projects that protect and restore land, coastal, marine, and freshwater resources, enhance the capacity of communities to support natural resource management and conservation, support sustainable agriculture, fishing, and aquaculture practices, strengthen ecosystems and communities affected by climate change, supporting education initiatives that promote behavior that protects the environment, and advocating for sustainable consumption to build economies that uses resources more efficiently.

More than \$18 million in Foundation global grant funding has been allocated to environment-related projects over the past five years. Creating a distinct area of focus to support the environment gives Rotary members even more ways to bring about positive change in the world and increase our impact. The Environmental Sustainability Rotary Action Group (ESRAG) was formed in 2015 and is carrying out ambitious plans to make a real difference in creating a world for future generations where our environment thrives. 



Your Report from the PolioPlus Corner

<u>GPEI Polio Eradication Plan.</u> Almost two years ago, the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI) published a 5-year plan to eliminate both wild and vaccine-derived polio cases worldwide by the end of calendar year 2023. This would allow polio to be formally declared as eradicated in calendar year 2026, after the customary 3year certification waiting period to assure that it had not re-emerged.

In September 2023, an Independent Monitoring Board (IMB) composed of a panel of worldwide health experts conducted a totally independent midterm review of the GPEI plan and cautioned that this goal was unlikely to be met, despite the fact that most indicators were moving in a positive direction. Specifically, it concluded that the goal of eliminating all wild polio cases by end of 2023 was "off track" and likely would be missed, and that the parallel goal of eliminating all vaccine-derived cases also by end of 2023 would definitely be missed. Reasons given were complex but centered on difficulty of accessing children to vaccinate them, and on lack of sufficient funds and quantities of the new mutation-resistant oral polio vaccine.

Calendar year 2024 has arrived and the IMB's conclusions have both been realized. Both goals have been missed. So what's the new plan?

In mid-October 2023, GPEI issued tentative revisions to its 5-year plan, based on the IMB review. My summary of these revisions is as follows:

- Goal One (Wild Polio Cases): Extend the elimination goal for wild polio by one year (end of 2023 to end of 2024) and shorten the traditional 3-year certification waiting period by one year from 2024-2026 to 2025-2026.
- Goal Two (Vaccine-Derived Cases): Extend the elimination goal for vaccine-derived polio by two years (end of 2023 to end of 2025) and then determine what certification waiting period is appropriate.


All of this serves to remind us of the difficulties faced in achieving Rotary's number one humanitarian goal. And of the fact that this goal includes both end points, and timelines to achieve those end points. In this case, the basic end points remain unchanged—only the timelines to achieve them have changed.

Reminder: Health authorities universally use the calendar year, not the Rotary year, in reporting all of their efforts.
