Hi Everyone. I finalized this article while I was at the Rotary International Convention in Melbourne (hence the banner). It was amazing seeing the displays of projects that originated from peoples' imaginations with support from TRF. It's inspiring!

Wow, this Rotary year went by fast. We are now in our final month of the RY. Here is a quick update for you. We currently have donated \$431,340 to the Annual Fund-SHARE. If every Rotarian in our district was at least a Sustaining Member, along with the 397 PHS members our cumulative 2022-2023 could be at least \$544,100. For PolioPlus we are at \$76,359, 18% above last year's giving at this time, but we still have 9 clubs that have not donated to PolioPlus. We can still make this a 100% PolioPlus and Sustaining Member District. I know we can.

With this RY coming to a close, I hope that you will continue to "Imagine", a world without conflict, hate, or hunger. I also hope you will take action to make it come true by setting up a \$10 monthly recurring donation in Rotary Direct to the Annual Fund-SHARE. Imagine if Rotarians did that our district would be a 100% club-TRF giving in the first month of RY23-24 and by the end of the RY.

Imagine if on World Polio Day, October 24th every D7610 Rotarian made a one-time donation to PolioPlus of \$25. That would be an immediate \$50,000 from our district going to PolioPlus and making our district a 100% club giving district for PolioPlus.

This will be my last article as the District Annual Fund Giving Chair as I will be moving to a different district position in the new Rotary year. I have had the pleasure of writing articles for the past six years. In case you haven't figured it out, I believe in and support TRF and its work. Without the support from Rotarians like you to TRF many Rotary club projects would never have happened. Thank you for your support.

Inspiration begins with dreams and imagination, which are then put into action. I encourage you all to keep "Imagine Rotary" in your hearts and minds.






