# Peter's Page—People Everywhere Are Created Equal

The title of this article came out of the District Peace Conference held on April 21<sup>st</sup>. District Rotarian Ralph Menzel supplied it. If you haven't already realized it, the title's acronym is "PEACE."

How does Peace fit in with The Rotary Foundation (TRF)? It fits in throughout TRF. Its key component is conflict resolution, which applies to wars (which is what most people think of when they hear "Peace") and applies to gangs, bullying, and just about anything that causes conflicts. Did you know that the anticipated cause of the next war in the middle east will be about water, not oil? Conflicts are being caused by a lack of food and water and the mass migrations happening because of this. If you look at TRF's areas of focus, their objectives overlap with the ultimate purpose of improving people's health, economic, education, and environmental, conditions to eliminate conflicts and improve their lives.

TRF does this through projects that Rotarians develop and execute, which are made possible by our donations to the Annual Fund -SHARE That is the reason I write these articles and encourage everyone to support



TRF. How can you help? If you are not already, become a Sustaining Member. That is a cumulative donation of \$100 to the Annual Fund-SHARE every Rotary year. Check your club's giving strategy to ensure it includes PolioPlus. The disease surveillance network set up by the End Polio Now campaign supports more than just

Polio eradication. It also monitors for other critical diseases in support of the areas of focus. Help us to make our district a 100% club Annual Fund-SHARE and PolioPlus giving district.

Here is a quick update for you. We currently have donated \$413,332 to the Annual Fund-SHARE. Our district has approximately 397 Rotarians who are either listed as Paul Harris Society (PHS) members or PHS eligible (some of those Rotarians may not have contributed to the Annual Fund-SHARE). The district currently has 1864 members. If every Rotarian in our district was at least a Sustaining Member we could expect our cumulative RY 2022-2023 to be at least \$544,100. For PolioPlus we are at \$71,792, 11% above last year's giving at this time but still have 11 clubs that have not given to it. Let's make those 100% PolioPlus and Sustaining Member goals. I know we can. Thanks for reading!

Thank you to all who have supported and continue to support our polio eradication efforts. You are already a part of history, Although we're close to eradicating polio, we're not done yet. We still need you to help educate your fellow Rotarians on the importance of continued immunization and surveillance efforts.

COUNTRIES – AFGHANSTAN AND PAISTAN. Until poliovirus transmission is interrupted in these counties, all countries – including the US – remain at risk of importation of polio, especially vulnerable countries with weak public health and immunization services and travel or trade links to endemic countries.

Eighteen million people around the world who would have died or been paralyzed are alive and walking because of the polio eradication campaign. Health workers and volunteers supported by PolioPlus grants have built an infrastructure for delivering health care and collecting data that, in many parts of the world, didn't exist before. It's already being used to improve overall health care and to fight other diseases, proving that the legacy of PolioPlus is more than eradicating a deadly disease from the planet — it's also building a stronger health system that provides better access to lifesaving interventions for the world's most vulnerable children.

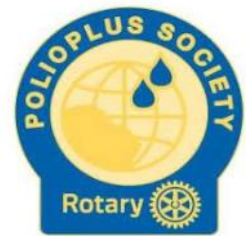
