This morning we welcome Rachel DeCosta, regional vice president of Bethesda-based Calvert Investments, where she has worked for more than 10 years.


Rachel will discuss the growing interest in socially responsible investing, which can include "sustainable and responsible" mutual funds. These funds feature thematic strategies such
