Today's Speaker

Hunter Herron, Ph.D. The Search for Extrasolar Planets

Our speaker this week is Hunter Herron, who discussed the future of the petroleum industry at our May 12 meeting.

Today, Hunter's topic is the ongoing search for planets outside our own solar system. NASA – in collaboration with several scientific organizations in Western Europe – recently launched a scientific satellite dedicated solely to the search for earth-like planets orbiting other stars.

Hunter is a leader in an informal group of scientists who have developed a series of lectures on the interaction among science, ethics, and public policy regarding such topics as the definition of life, consciousness, the human genome, and global stewardship of the environment.

Hunter holds B.S., M.S., and Ph.D. degrees in chemical engineering from Tulane University. He has had a life-long interest in astronomy and paleoanthropology.
