Anthony H. Griffin Fairfax County Executive

Today we are honored to welcome Fairfax County Executive Anthony H. Griffin, who has served as the county's administrative leader since 2000. He has served Fairfax County for 23 years, and is the second-longest serving county executive since the position was created in

1952. Mr. Griffin plans to retire in April.

During his tenure as county executive, Mr. Griffin has carefully managed county resources to address a population that has grown to 1.08 million people, an increased jobs base of 580,000, and the county's general-fund budget of \$3.46 billion.

Under his leadership, Fairfax County was named "one of the bestmanaged jurisdictions in America" by

Governing magazine, which also gave the county a No. 1 rating in the Pew Charitable Trust's Government Performance Project.

Fairfax County has consistently received bond ratings of AAA from the three major bond-rating services. Only 23 counties in the United States have received AAA ratings from all three services. The county also has the lowest rate of violent crime in the nation.

Mr. Griffin joined Fairfax County in 1989 as deputy county executive for planning and development. From October 1996 to August 1997, he served as acting county executive.

Previously, Mr. Griffin was city

manager for the City of Falls Church, deputy county manager for Arlington County, and served as a U.S. Marine Corps officer in Vietnam.

"I enter the next phase of my life with mixed emotions. I am excited but uncertain about my future, and I will miss continuing in my current capacity," Mr. Griffin told county employees when he announced his retirement last November.

"Tony Griffin has been an exceptional county executive," said Board of Supervisors Chairman Sharon Bulova.

Mr. Griffin joins us today thanks to President Ingrid Parris-Hicklin, who herself retired from county service last month
