Christopher Zimmerman

Fairfax Symphony Orchestra

Today we welcome Christopher Zimmerman, conductor of the Fairfax Symphony Orchestra. Chris was appointed in 2009 as only the third music director in the Symphony's 55-year history.

Chris has performed with many of the world's most prominent orchestras, including the Royal Philharmonic, the London Symphony Orchestra, and the Royal Liverpool Philharmonic. In 1989, he co-founded and became music director of the City of London Chamber Orchestra.

Prior to his appointment to the Fairfax Symphony, Chris was music director of the Hartt Symphony and Primrose Fuller Professor of Orchestral Studies at the Hartt School. He previously held music director positions at the Symphony of Southeast Texas, the Bangor Symphony Orchestra, the City of London Chamber Orchestra, and the Cincinnati Concert Orchestra.

Chris holds a B.A. in music from Yale and an M.A. from the University of Michigan.
