Terry McAuliffe GreenTech Automotive Inc.

Today we welcome Terry McAuliffe, chairman of GreenTech Automotive (GTA) in McLean. He will discuss this entrepreneurial venture that is building electric and hybrid cars for sale around the world.

The company was founded by Mr. McAuliffe and Charles Wang in 2006, and currently has a plant operating in Mississippi and two more

plants under construction in Mississippi and China.

GreenTech plans to market five vehicles at different prices, both electric and hybrid (electric with combustion engine), with the "MyCar" slated for U.S. production by the end of this year.

Mr. McAuliffe served as chairman of the Democratic National Committee from 2001 to 2005. He served as co-chairman of President Clinton's 1996 re-election campaign and also served as chairman of Hillary Clinton's presidential campaign in 2008.
